Honoring Our Veterans with Prayer

Two decades after World War I, which officially ended November 11, 1918, the U.S. passed legislation to have a legal holiday every November 11th, honoring veterans who served in that war. As time marched on and more wars were fought, Veterans Day became a national holiday honoring American veterans of all wars.

Before personally knowing someone who fought in a war. I didn't give much thought to Veterans Day, other than the commercial aspect of a few good sales. I regret my previously flippant recognition of this important day.

Before Bill went to fight in Iraq, he was an electrician with the same company for 25 years. His children were mostly out of the nest and he and his wife were looking forward to their retirement years. However, after the 9-11 terrorist attacks, Bill joined the Virginia Army National Guard. It seemed unlikely he'd be called to serve overseas since the reserves had not been called up for war since World War II. His family was shocked when he left for the war in Iraq and was gone for 18 months.

When Bill returned in 2005. his family welcomed home a courageous and radically changed man who had lived through horrible events. His time away was spent in

He told of entering a city where a beheaded man was leaned up against a post hand-written sign on chest translated, "This is what will happen to anyone who speaks to the Americans." He recounted how deeply the enemy hates and wants to destroy all Americans. He carried the bodies of young men in his unit whose lives were cut short by the dining hall suicide bomber in Mosul. The horror stories could fill a book.

His heart was broken for those in his unit who suffered and died; most of them young enough to be his son. He cried for their parents; knowing how devastating it would be to lose a child. Bill was awarded the Purple Heart for his war injuries during battle. He still struggles with the memories of all the evil, death, and danger. He has severe posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) along with physical pain from his injuries. He's totally disabled.


Bill's one of thousands of veterans who are celebrated on this day. They fought so we could be safe from our enemies. They demonstrated the greatest love for us. A national holiday is hardly enough to show them our gratitude and respect. We can't undo anything they've been through, but we can do what the Bible tells us to do - love them and pray for them.

GIVE THANKS IN EVERYTHING

"Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Did you thank God today? For what, you may ask? For anything other than your last meal.

Sometimes I can go an entire day without remembering God even once, much less thanking Him for His many gifts.

It is so easy to forget in the relative safety of the Western Church just how dependent on God we really are. No one is trying to kill or imprison us for our faith. Comfort can breed complacency. We need to combat this potential with the truth of God's Word.

THE RIGHT PERSPECTIVE

One of my favorite verses when thinking about being thankful to God is the first part of Acts 17:28: "For in Him we live and move and exist." You are alive today by the power of God. You got out of bed today, perhaps took a shower, got dressed for school or work, and ate breakfast all because God is actively sustaining you. You exist because He continues to will that you exist.

Realizing this gives a completely new perspective to Jesus' words, "Apart from Me you can do nothing." When you remind yourself just how much God has given you

and just how much you need Him for everything, you can't help but thank Him.

AN ATTITUDE OF GRATITUDE

I want you to try something for a minute...

Close your eyes, focus on your breathing, and take five deep breaths. With each breath, I want you to simply pray "Thank you, Jesus."

Go ahead, do it now. Seriously, stop reading and do it. I can wait.

For most of us, being able to breathe is probably at the top of the list of things we take for granted. However, each breath you take is a gift from God. Taking time to thank God for this most fundamental necessity of life can help remind us to have a heart of thankfulness.


Whether it is the air you breathe, the new day's

WHEN TIMES ARE TOUGH


It's easy to thank God when everything is "as it should be." But chances are some of you reading this are going through some dark days right now. What do you do when you just don't feel like saying thank you for what's going on in your life? Here's two things to think about:

1. God not only said to give thanks in everything, He also said in Ephesians 5:20 to give thanks for everything. James 1:2-4 tells us that we should "consider it a great joy" when we face hard times because God uses those hard times to strengthen our faith. For reasons we will not always



2. Remember the example of David. In Psalm 116, David is praising God for rescuing him from death. In verse 17. David tells God he will offer Him a "sacrifice of thanksgiving." Sometimes saying thank you to God in hard times is really difficult. Acknowledge this

difficulty to God, and then thank Him anyway.



When all else fails, there is always one thing you can thank God for: the sacrifice of Jesus for your sins. You were once God's enemy, but now you are His friend. You were once a child of wrath, but now you are a child of righteousness. You were once destined for eternal death, but now you have eternal life. Even in your darkest hour, you can thank God you don't have to face that dark hour alone.
