






How To Serve God Dr. Charles Stanley

When we encounter opportunities to serve God, we don't always respond in the way He desires. Perhaps we think we can't because our schedule is too busy or we don't feel qualified.

Those knee-jerk reactions slam a door closed before we've discovered whether or not the Lord wants us to go through it. You've probably never thought of a refusal to serve God as a type of idolatry, but that's what it is—bowing down to self instead of submitting to Him.

The Lord desires that His servants be willing to do anything—and that they will seek His specific plan for them. He uniquely gifts followers to serve according to His will. But when we've already decided what we can't do, won't do, or are illequipped to do, then we're acting by our own will. That doesn't work.

You may serve the Lord as a godly parent, as a factory worker who shares the gospel with coworkers, or as a friend who takes time to listen to the hurting. No restriction exists on what God can do through the life of a willing helper. The strength of His Spirit overcomes human limitations. Don't have enough courage? God can fix that. Don't have the right skills? God can fix that.

Laying down our excuses is the wisest thing to do when serving the Lord. Trust that He will empower you to do whatever He calls you to do—and will see to it that you're properly equipped and trained to do it (Eph. 2:10; 2 Tim. 3:16-17).

All He asks is that you say yes.

Armed and Ready

When I was growing up, my stepdad was a plumber. It wasn't unusual for him to have to crawl under houses or up into attics to work on someone's faulty pipes. One time, he was squeezing into a crawl space under a pier and beam foundation when he saw a giant snake. He said it wasn't a grass snake. It looked more like someone's pet snake that had gotten loose and was living comfortably under this old house.

Needless to say, he had to fix the plumbing but didn't trust the snake, so very carefully he held a blow torch in one hand (that he could aim towards the snake occasionally to keep him at a distance) while he worked with his other hand to fix the pipes.

I don't know if I could've done it, but there's a story in Nehemiah that reminds me of my dad's bravery.

The walls of Jerusalem were being rebuilt and Israel's enemies weren't happy about it. There was threat of attack all the time. The Bible says,

"... with one hand they worked at construction, and with the other held a weapon. Every one of the builders had his sword girded at his side as he built ..." (Nehemiah 4:17-18 NKJV).

And just like my dad, they got the job done.

Today, we can use this imagery as a pattern of how to navigate our own lives. All of us are living constantly in a world influenced by the original snake— the devil. John said,

"We know that we are of God, and the whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one" (1 John 5:19 NKJV).

In other words, the enemy is always nearby and we would be foolish to put our weapons down while building for the kingdom of God.

It's not either/or.

It's imperative that we understand the importance of putting our hand to the plow so to speak, while also



ready with the weapons of our warfare.

And the best weapon any of us can carry is the Word of God.

When the enemy lunges at us unexpectedly, we need to be ready to use our authority and keep him at bay. Too often, Christians either spend all their time warding off the enemy and forget to take ground for God, or they get so focused on the task at hand they forget there's an enemy who has only one agenda— to kill, steal, and destroy.

At all times we must stay aware.

"See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:15-16 NKJV).

The New Living Translation says,

"Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days."

The best way to make the most of our opportunities is to keep our eyes on God while keeping a sword by our side— the sword of the Spirit. This simply means we stay ready and armed at all times. Nehemiah told his nobles to be ready but he also encouraged the people that God would fight for them. The same is true for us. Although we need to stay armed and ready, God doesn't

expect us to fight (or build) alone.

The Holy Spirit is within us. And I promise He has a fire that is greater than any blow torch. When we wield our sword (God's Word) under the influence of the Spirit, there's nothing we can't accomplish. And no enemy that can stop the work of God.

So stay armed. Stay ready. Keep your hand to the plow. God is watching over you.
