

It was just two weeks after Easter in 2005. My Papa was nearing the end of his long battle with cancer. Family and close friends traveled from near and far just to be in his presence one last time. The hospital room grew crowded and heavier as the time drew near. He said his final words to us, and solidified his promise to us: "I'll see you in the gives." morning!"

When I think back on this moment, my body can still feel the muscle memory of the lump in the throat that results

from a stifled cry, not fully understanding why laughter, telling stories of his pranks, and joy-of all things-was appropriate in this situation.

But this joy, even in the face of death, is the hope that Easter brings.

PERHAPS THIS EASTER YOU ARE IN THE MIDST OF DEATH, THE DEATH OF A LOVED ONE, A RELATIONSHIP, A DREAM, THECONSEQUENCES OF SIN.

The good news of the Easter story not only offers us the hope of the future glory of eternal life after death, but the lens through which to look in the meantime as we gaze at Jesus' life, death and resurrection.
